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GENERAL INFORMATION

OAKWOOD UNIVERSITY BRIEF HISTORY

Oakwood University, which began as an industrial school, was founded by the Seventh-day Adventist Church in 1896 to educate African-Americans in the South. The school was erected on 380 acres purchased during the previous year for \$6,700. Additional property secured in 1918 nearly tripled its land holding. The school underwent several name changes over its history:

- 1896 – Oakwood Industrial School
- 1904 – Oakwood Manual Training School
- 1917 – Oakwood Junior College
- 1943 – Oakwood College
- 2008 – Oakwood University

Several principals served the school until it achieved Junior College status and elected its first president, James I. Beardsley, in 1917.

In 1943, Oakwood received its first accreditation as a junior college, having already begun the process of achieving senior college status. Fifteen years later, in 1958, it was accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award associate and baccalaureate degrees. The most recent reaffirmation of accreditation was voted in June, 2001. In addition, continuing accreditation by the Adventist Accrediting Association was granted in April, 2006. On January 1, 2008, Oakwood College became Oakwood University offering its first masters degree in pastoral studies.

Student enrollment and graduation statistics have grown significantly since Oakwood's inception. When the school first opened in 1896, there were 16 students. By 1917, there were more than 100 students. Enrollment peaked at 200 in 1927. Enrollment first topped 1000 during the 1974-75 academic year. Enrollment for Fall 2007 was 1824. Spring Semester 2008, Oakwood enrolled its first 22 graduate students.

The first graduating class in 1909 numbered five. Nine years later (1918), the first two graduates of Oakwood Junior College received degrees. The first senior college graduating class (Spring, 1945) consisted of nine students. Twenty-eight years later, in 1973, the first class in the history of the college to exceed 100 members graduated (124). The first graduating class in excess of 200 finished just nine years later in 1982. The most recent graduating class (2007) totaled 266.

Oakwood University has a beautiful natural setting on 1,185 acres of prime land. It is considered one of the historical landmarks of the city of Huntsville, a cosmopolitan city of approximately 175,000 people located in north central Alabama. The university prepares students from across America and from many other nations to serve God and humanity in a variety of

positions and careers. Over 60 percent of the culturally diverse faculty hold doctorate degrees from a wide range of universities and colleges around the nation and world.

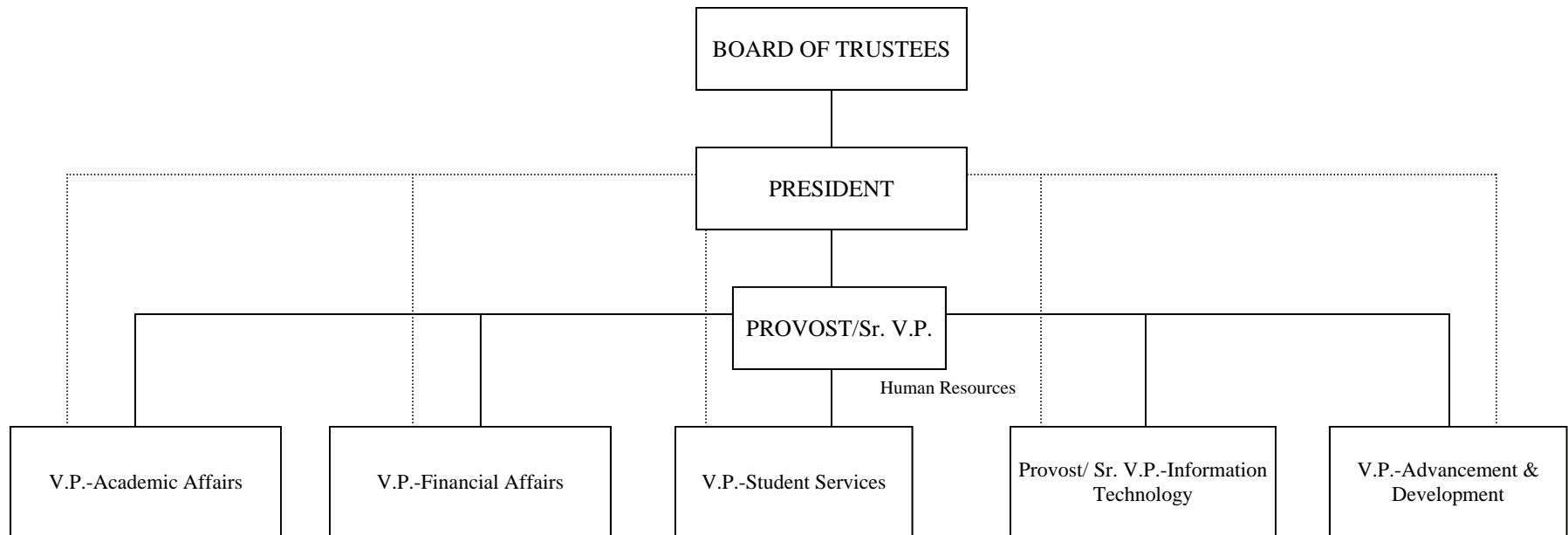

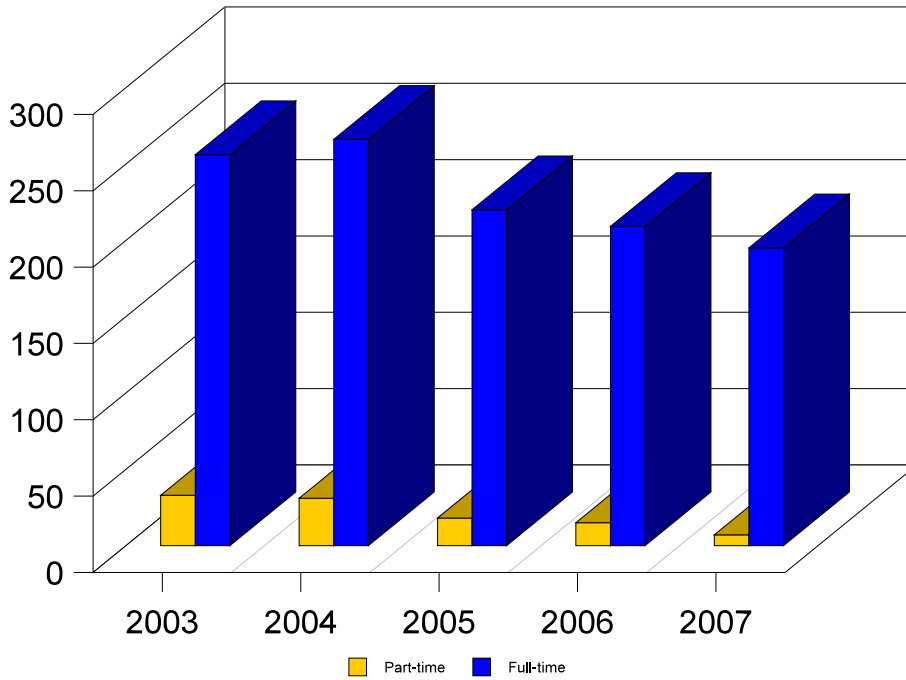

STAFF BY CATEGORY 2003-2007

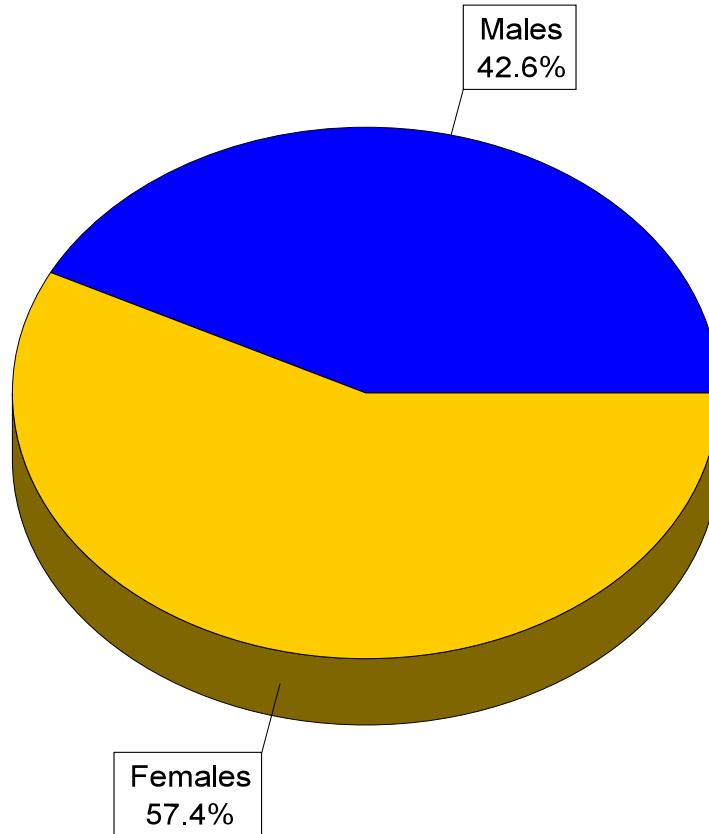

Fall 2007

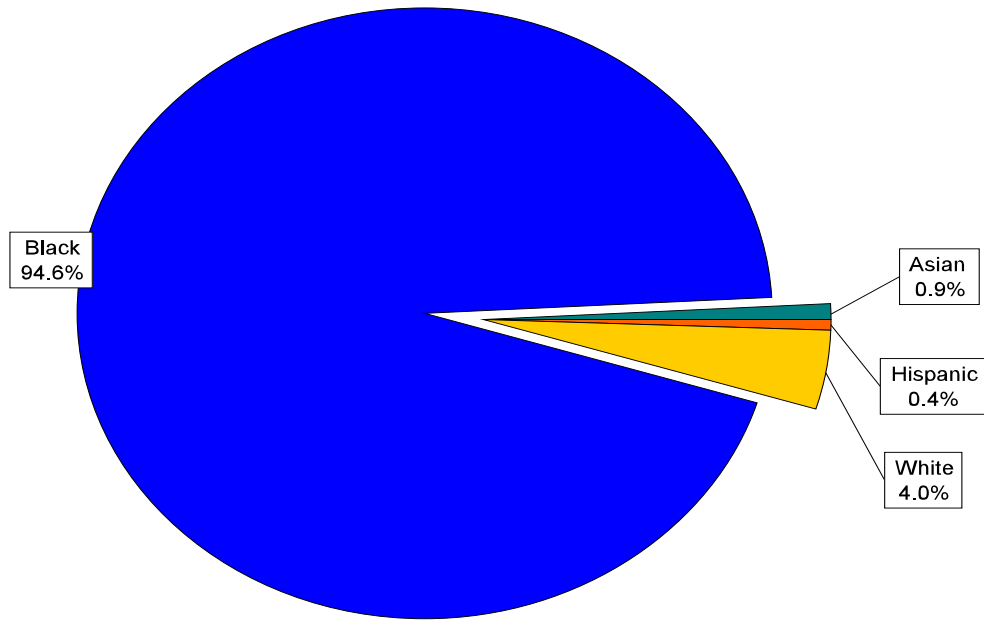


Females = 116

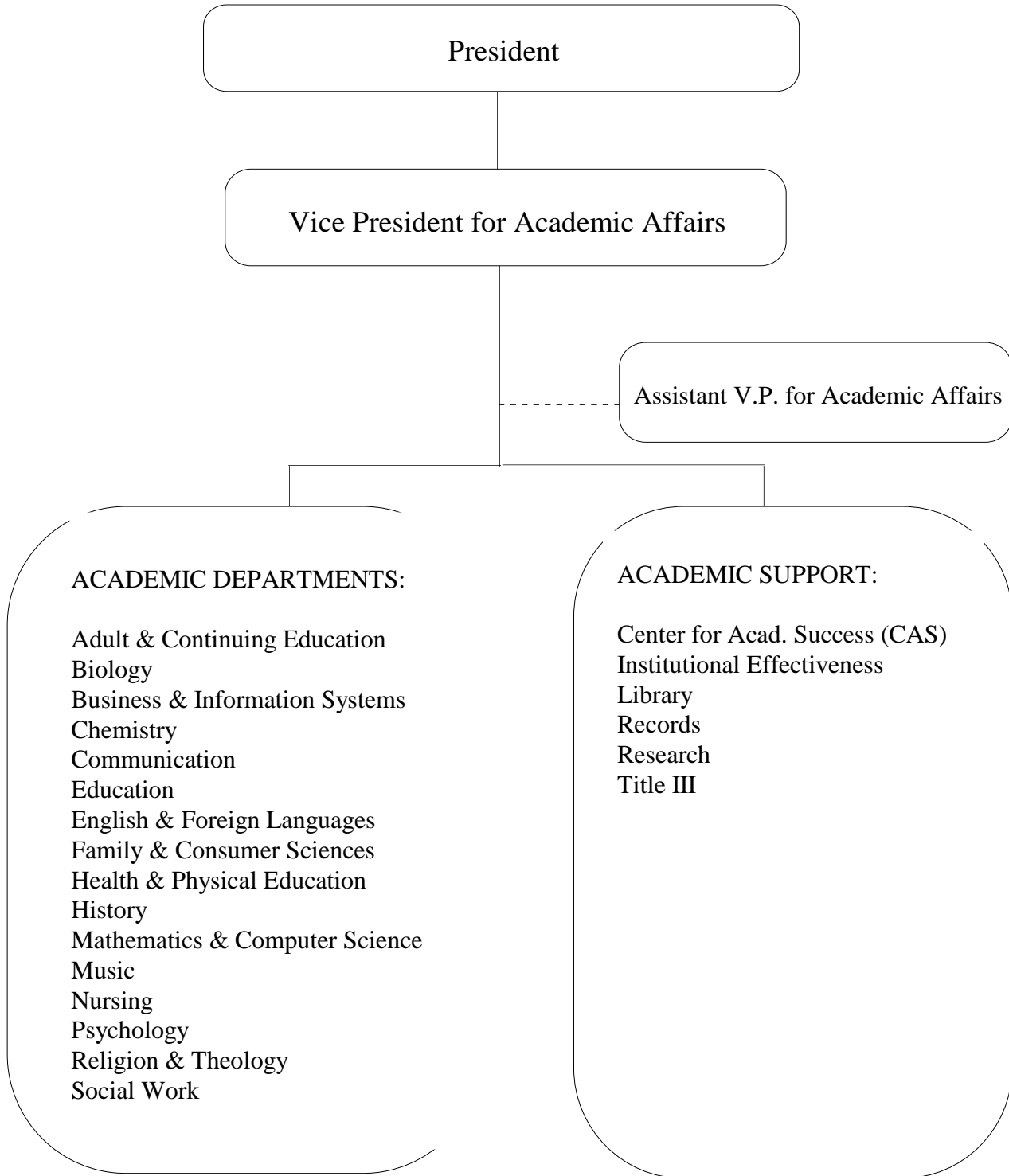

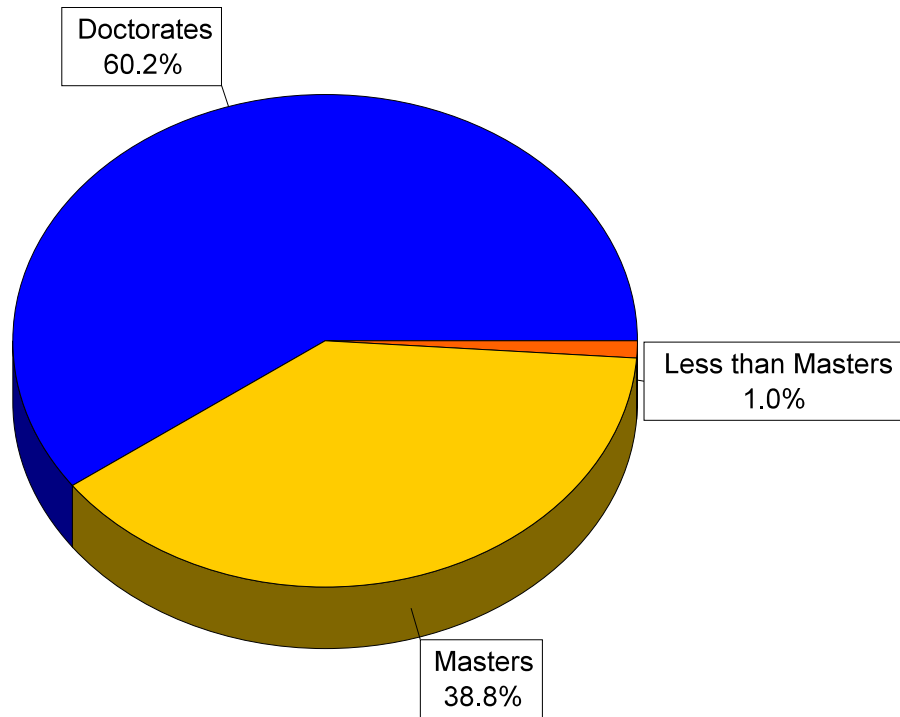

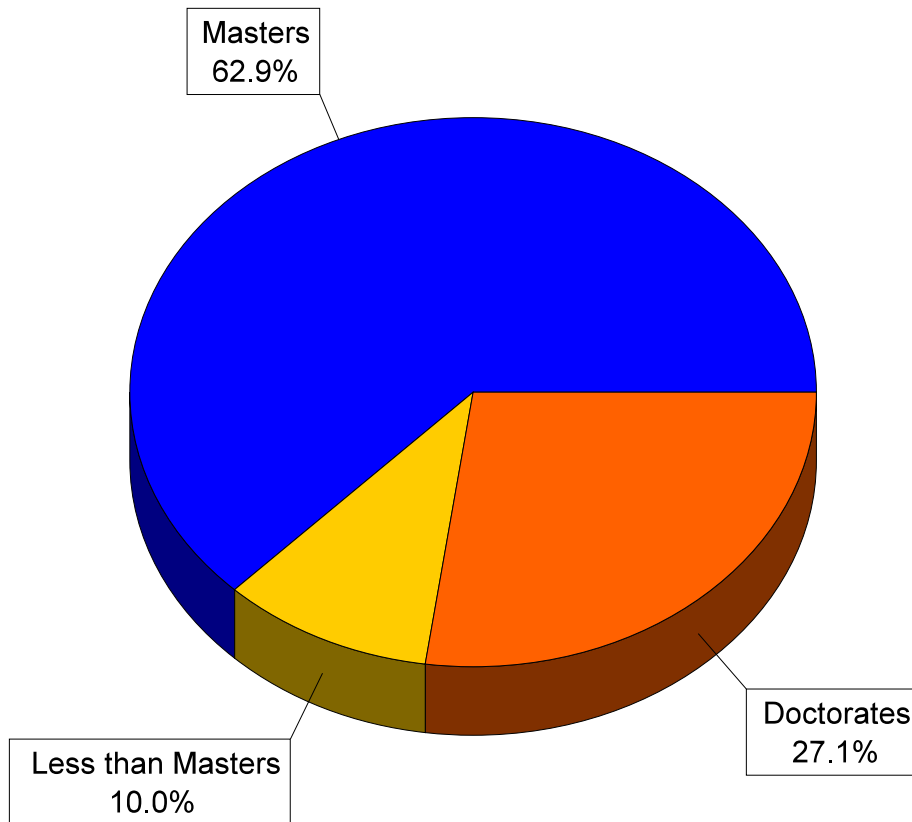

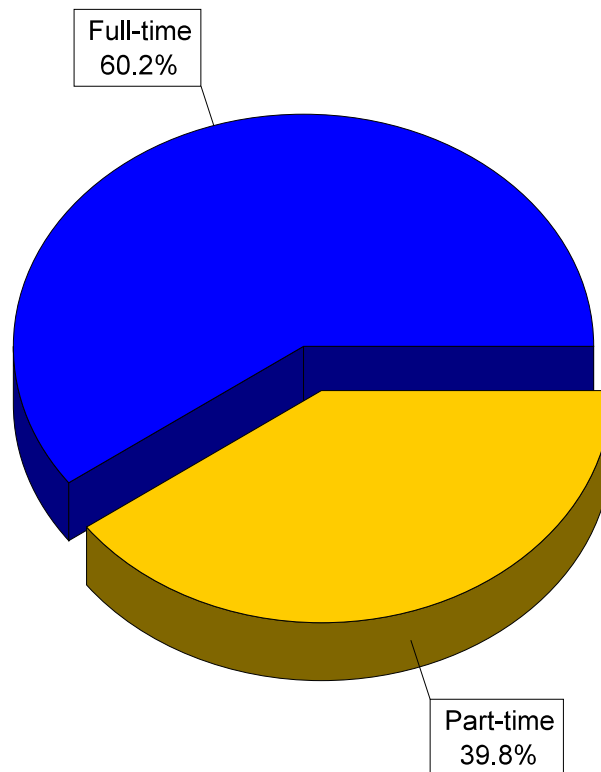

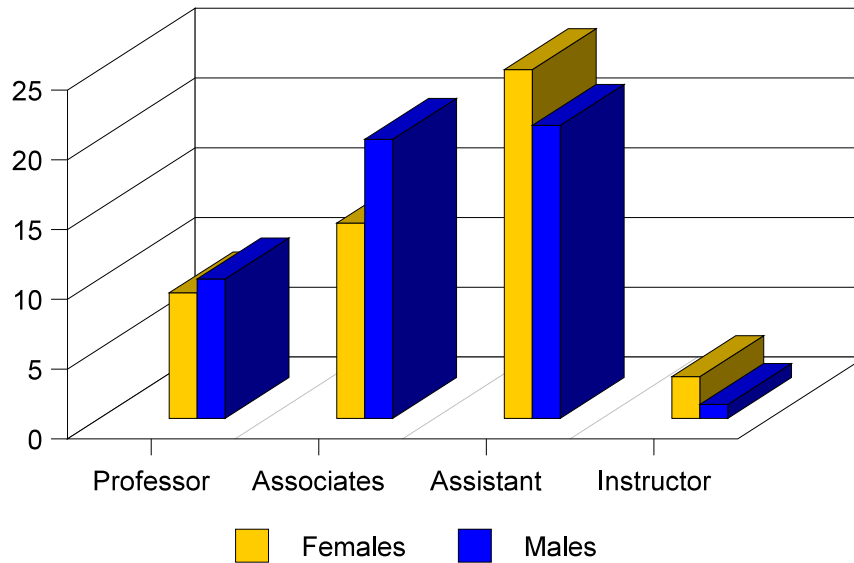

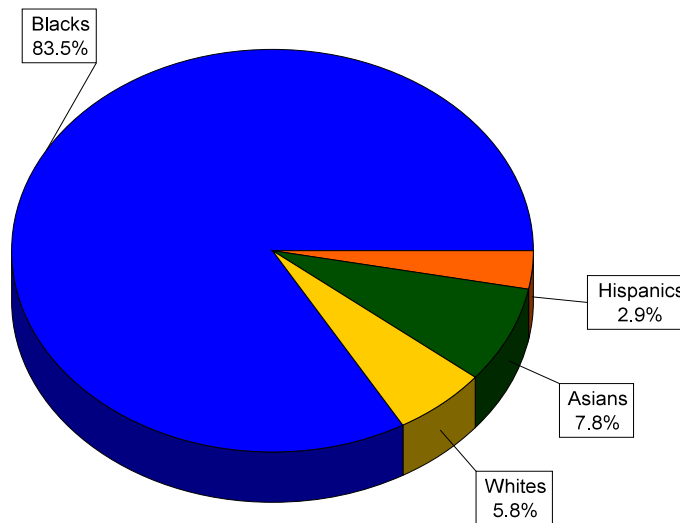

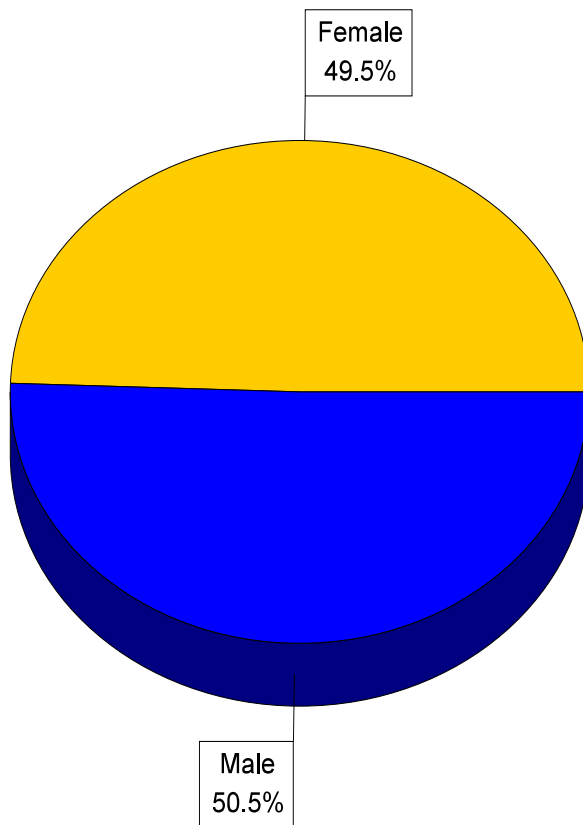

BY ETHNICITY**

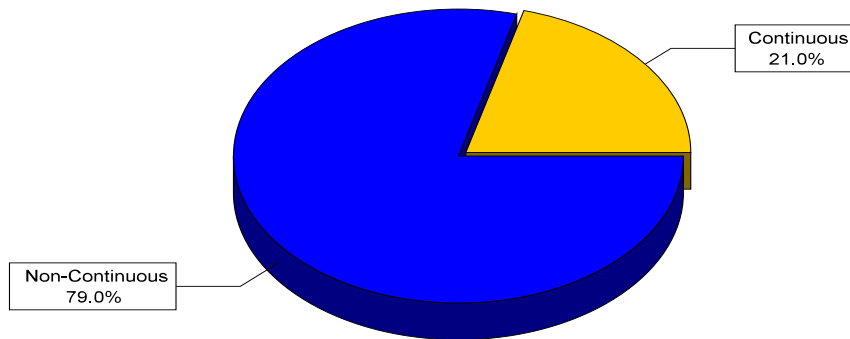


PERCENTAGE OF FULL-TIME INSTRUCTIONAL FACULTY BY GENDER

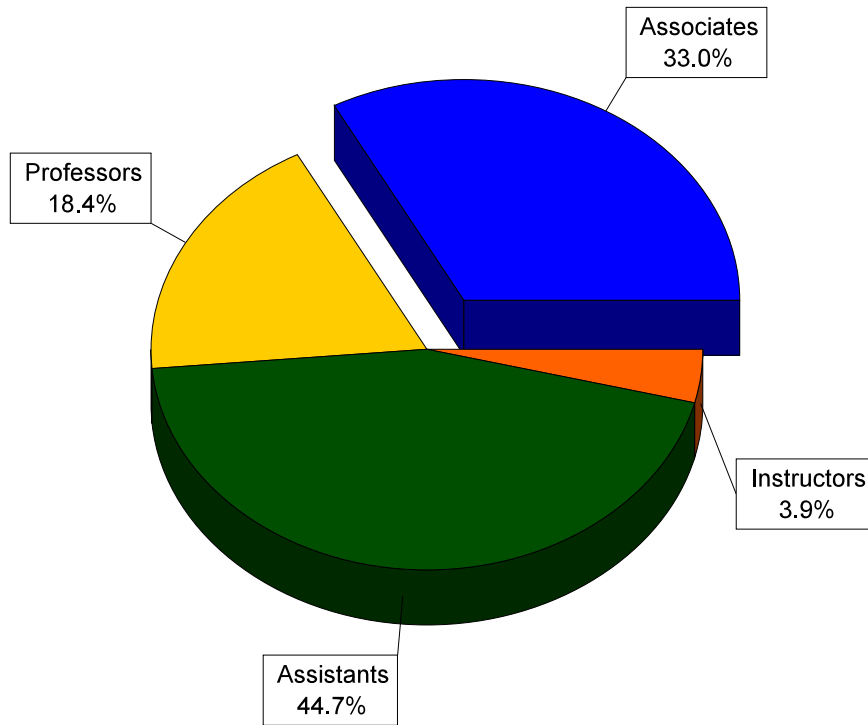

PERCENTAGE OF FULL-TIME INSTRUCTIONAL FACULTY BY RANK Spring 2008

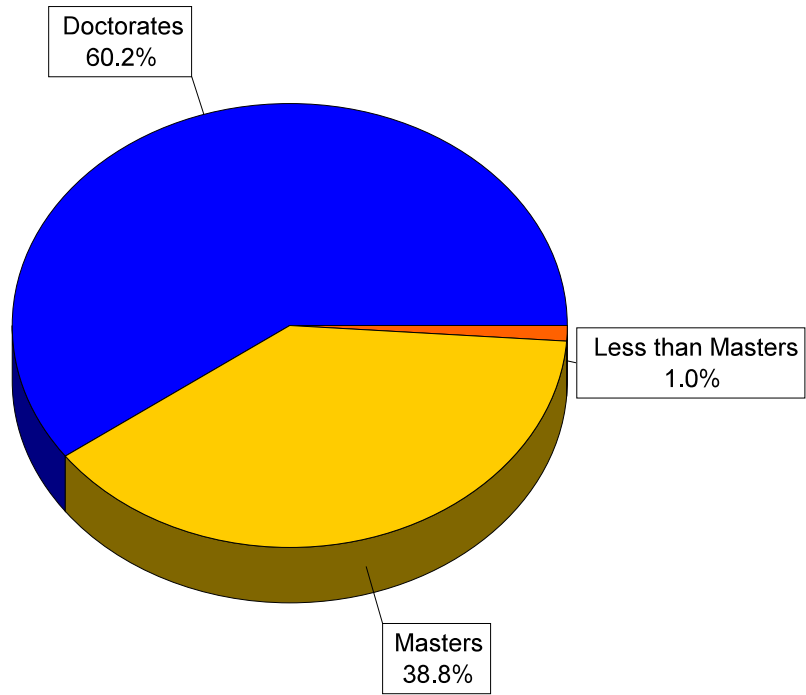

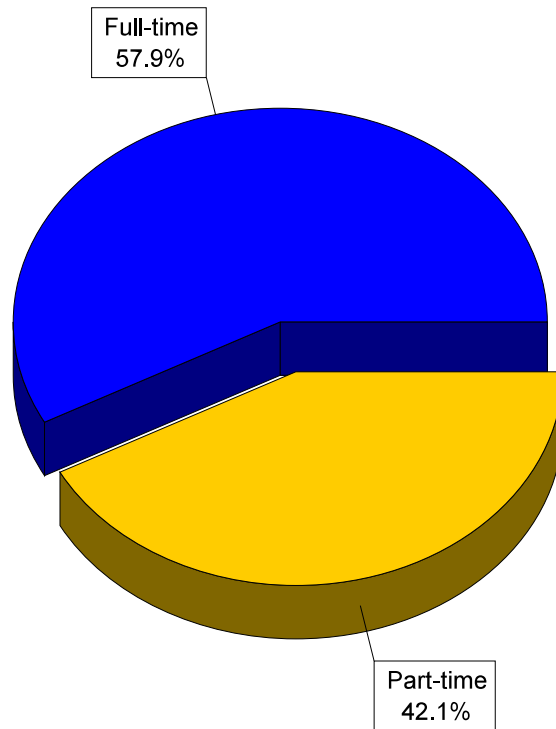

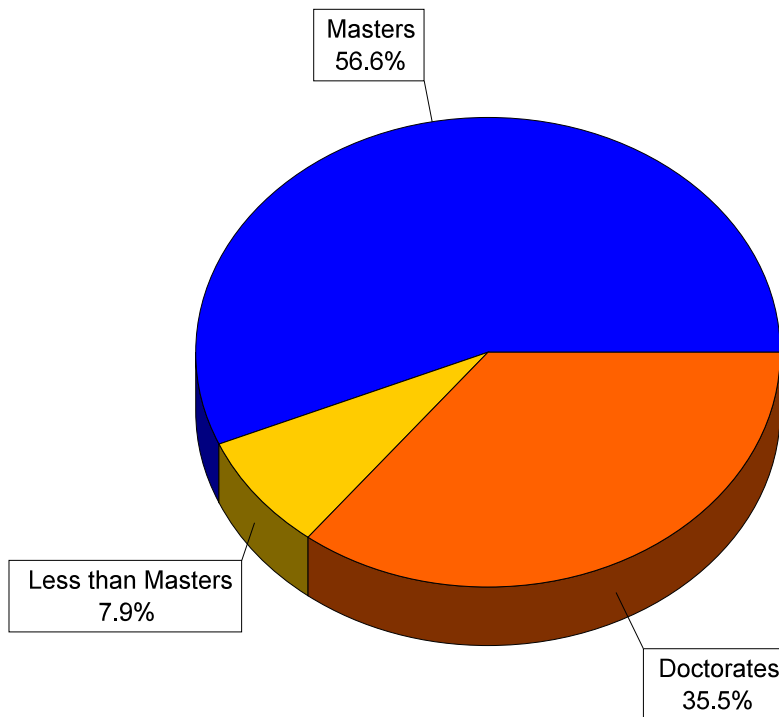

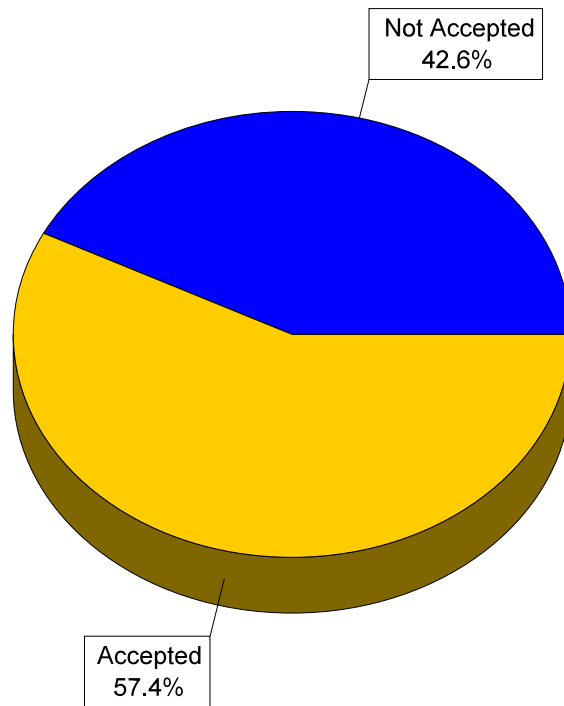

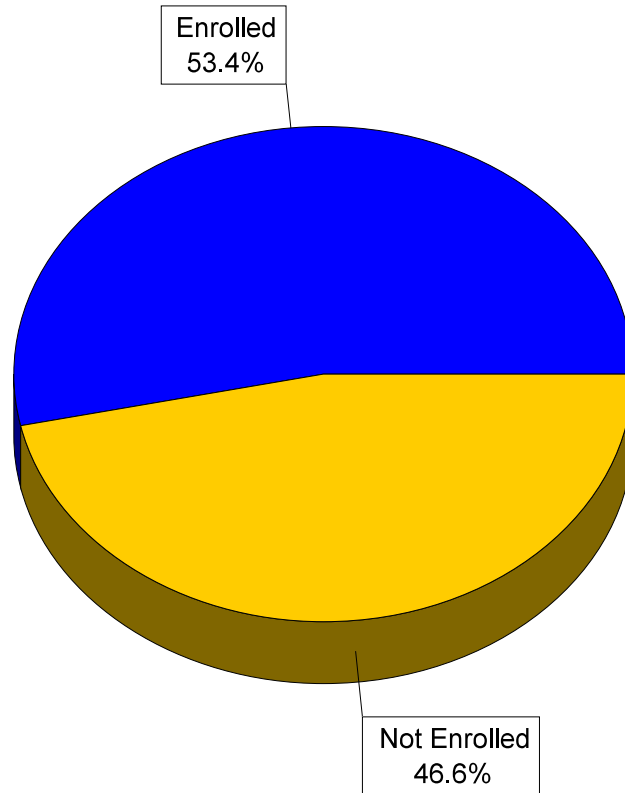
**PERCENTAGE OF APPLICANTS

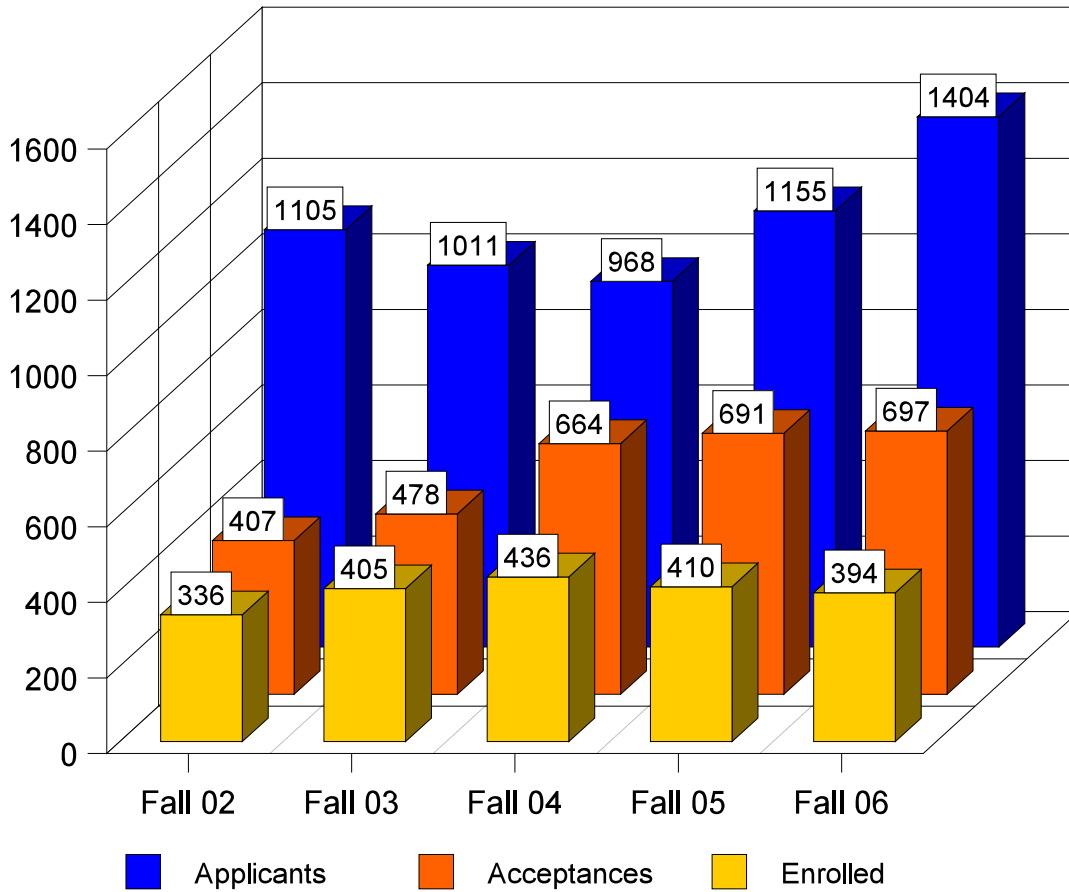

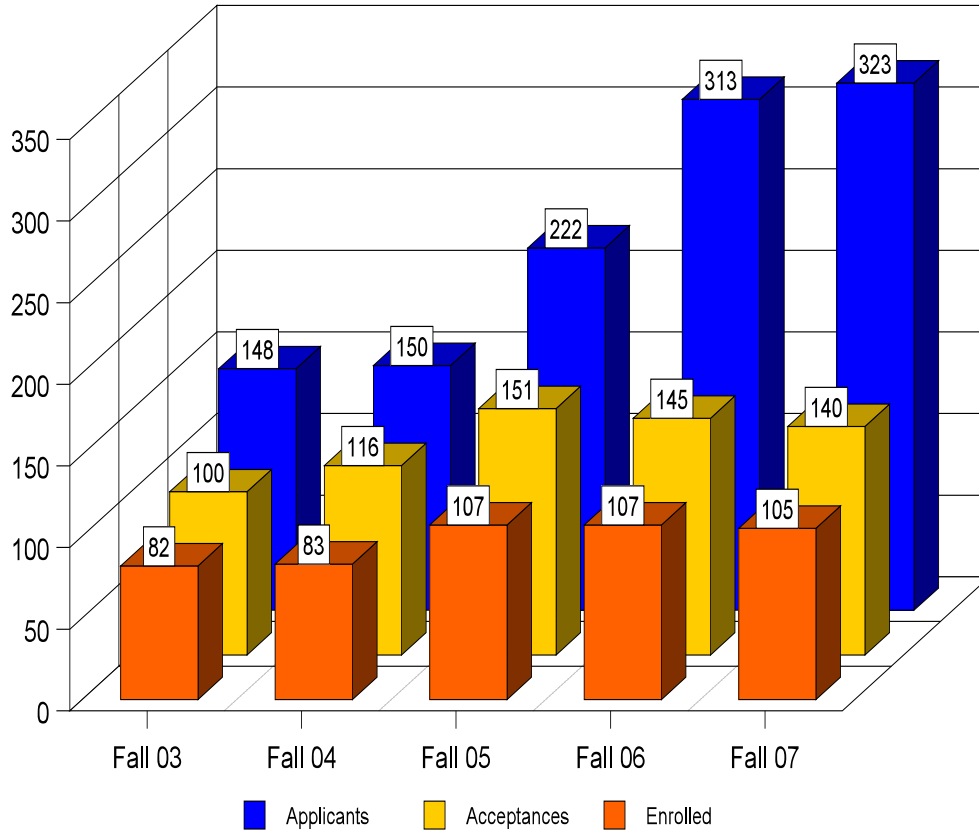

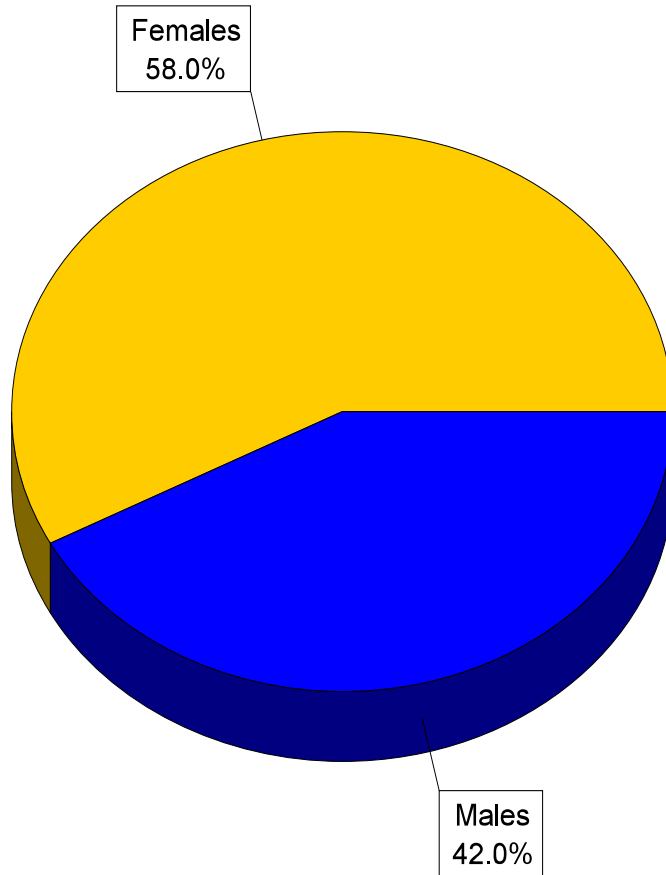

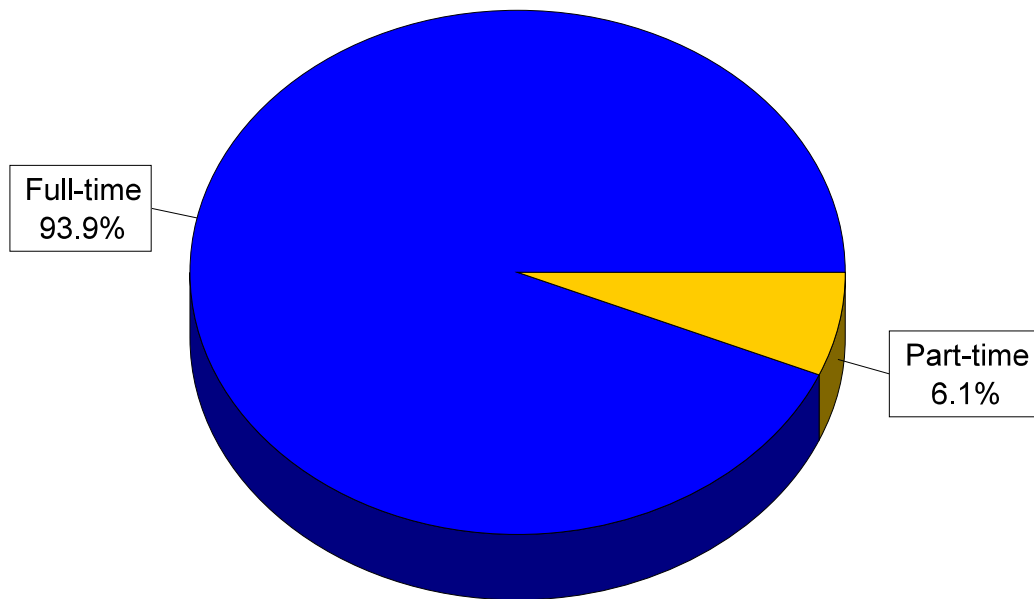

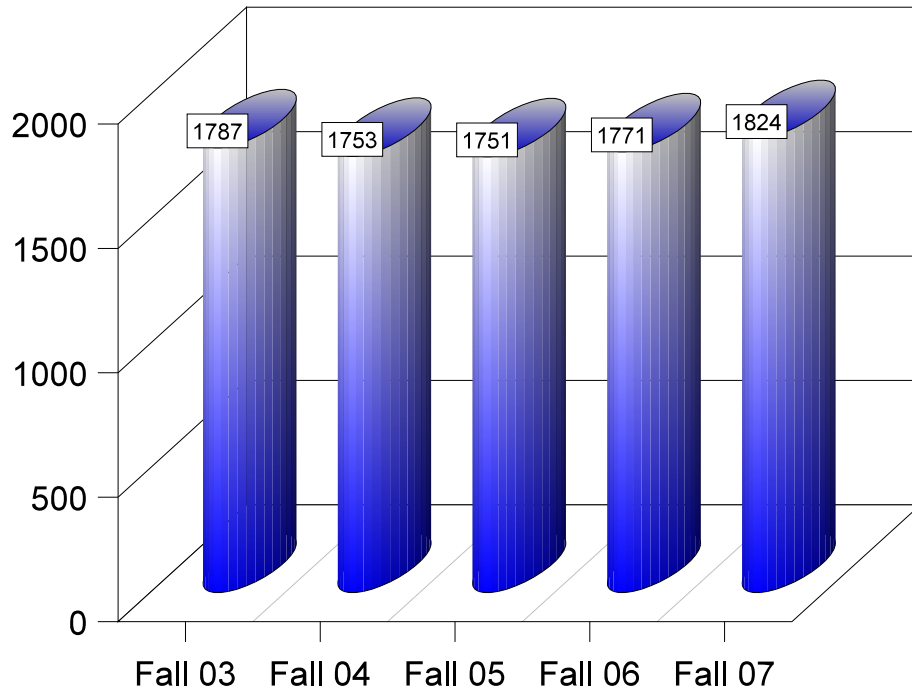

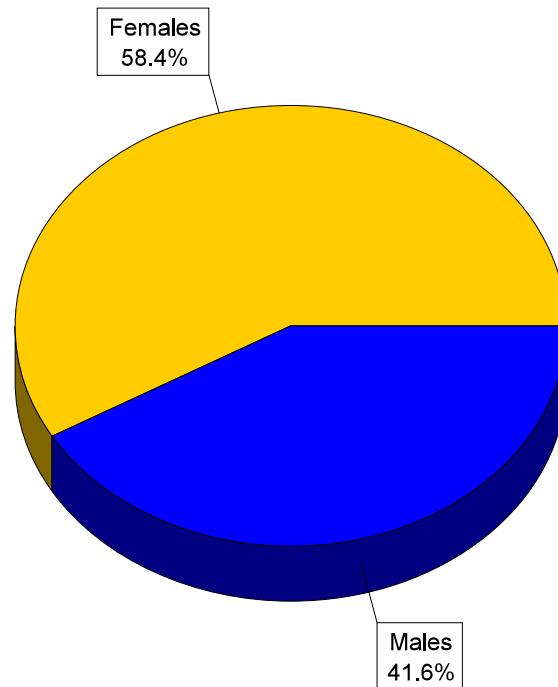

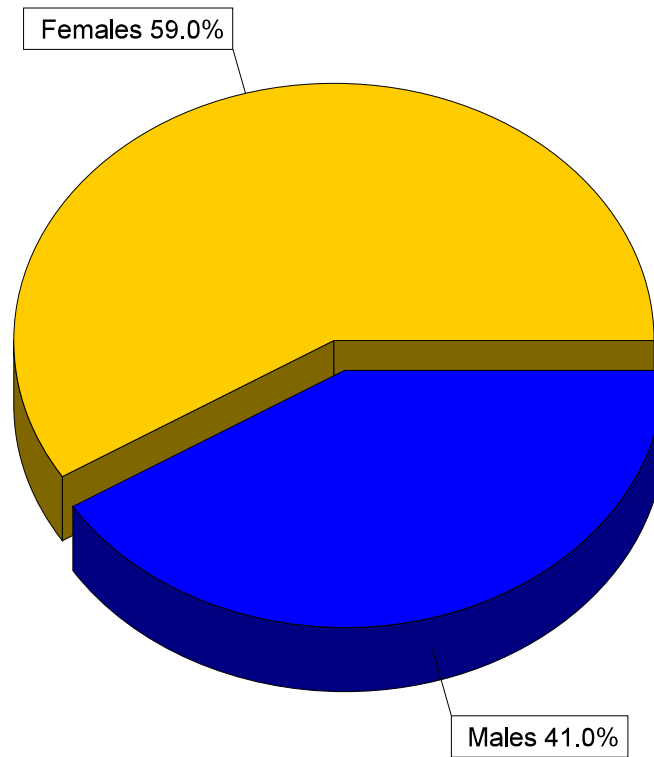

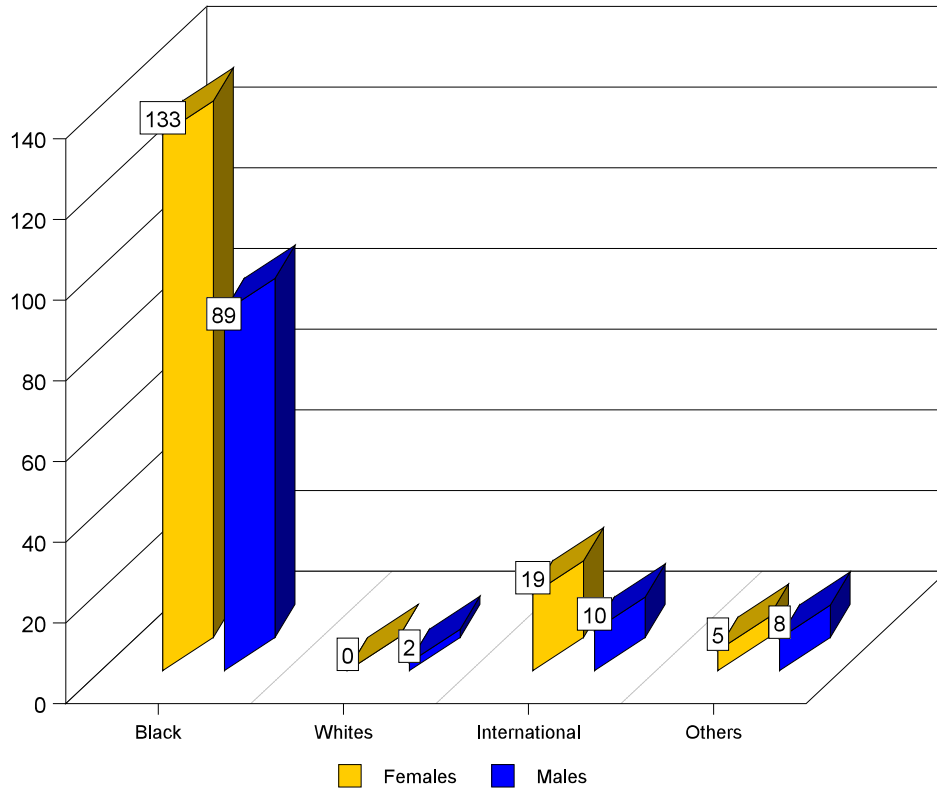

GRADUATES BY ETHNICITY AND GENDER 2007



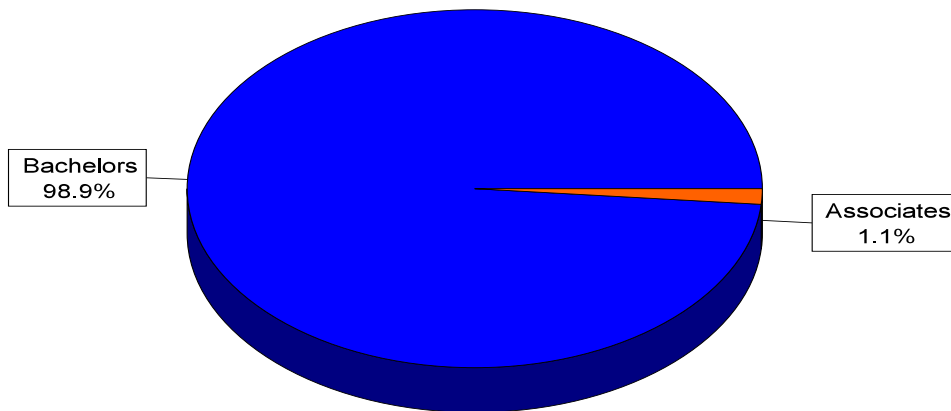

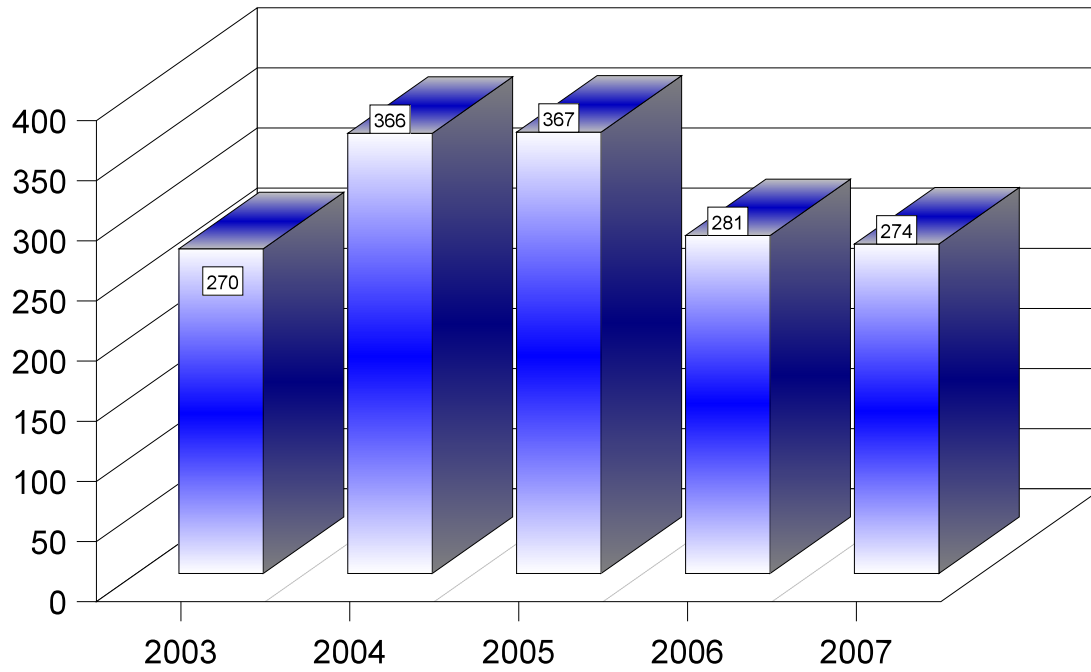

LIBRARY SERVICES

Research Assistance – The information Desk is located on the main floor of the library. Librarians provide assistance with all types of questions, expertise in developing research strategies, and help with using library resources in a variety of formats and around the world.

Consultations – Individuals may schedule appointments with reference librarians when an extended time is needed for research.

Instruction - Learn how to locate, evaluate, use, and communicate information effectively. Librarians provide instruction in these skills that is specific to the needs of individuals, small, groups and classes.

Interlibrary Loans - Books and articles not available at the Eva B. Dykes Library may be borrowed from other libraries to faculty, students and staff. Interlibrary loan requests usually take about 10 days for processing. There is a minimum \$10.00 charge for RUSH requests.

Media Resources – Houses and circulates non-print materials and equipment such as DVDs, videos, CDs, laptops, video and digital cameras, projectors and recorders. Listening and viewing facilities are also available for in-house use of materials.

Archives & Museum – This unique collection includes University documents, photographs, cassette and video tapes and Black Seventh-day Adventist historical materials. Museum artifacts and historical materials about Oakwood University and Black Seventh-day Adventists are displayed and exhibited.

Computer/Internet Access - 14 public access computers are available on the main floor. Another 42 networked computers are available in the computer lab, on the lower level, for use by faculty and students. Wireless service is also available in the building.

Photocopying & Printing - Black & white photocopying and printing cost 10 cents per page. Copiers are located on the main floor and the upper level.

Reserves - Items in high demand are available for two-hour loan periods.

Circulation - Checkout and return library materials, request items on reserve, retrieve printouts, pay fines, pick-up and return interlibrary loans, borrow select magazines.
