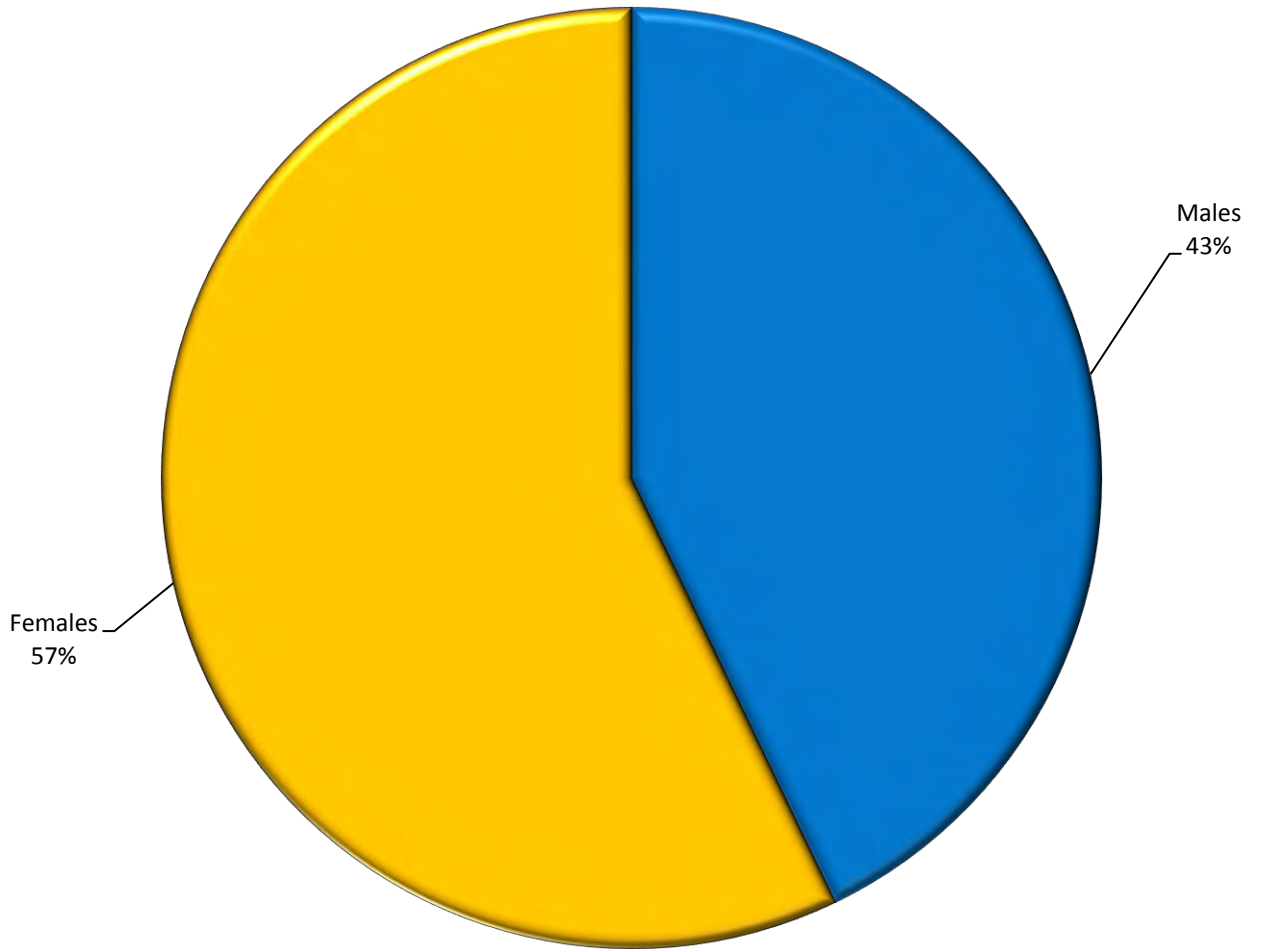

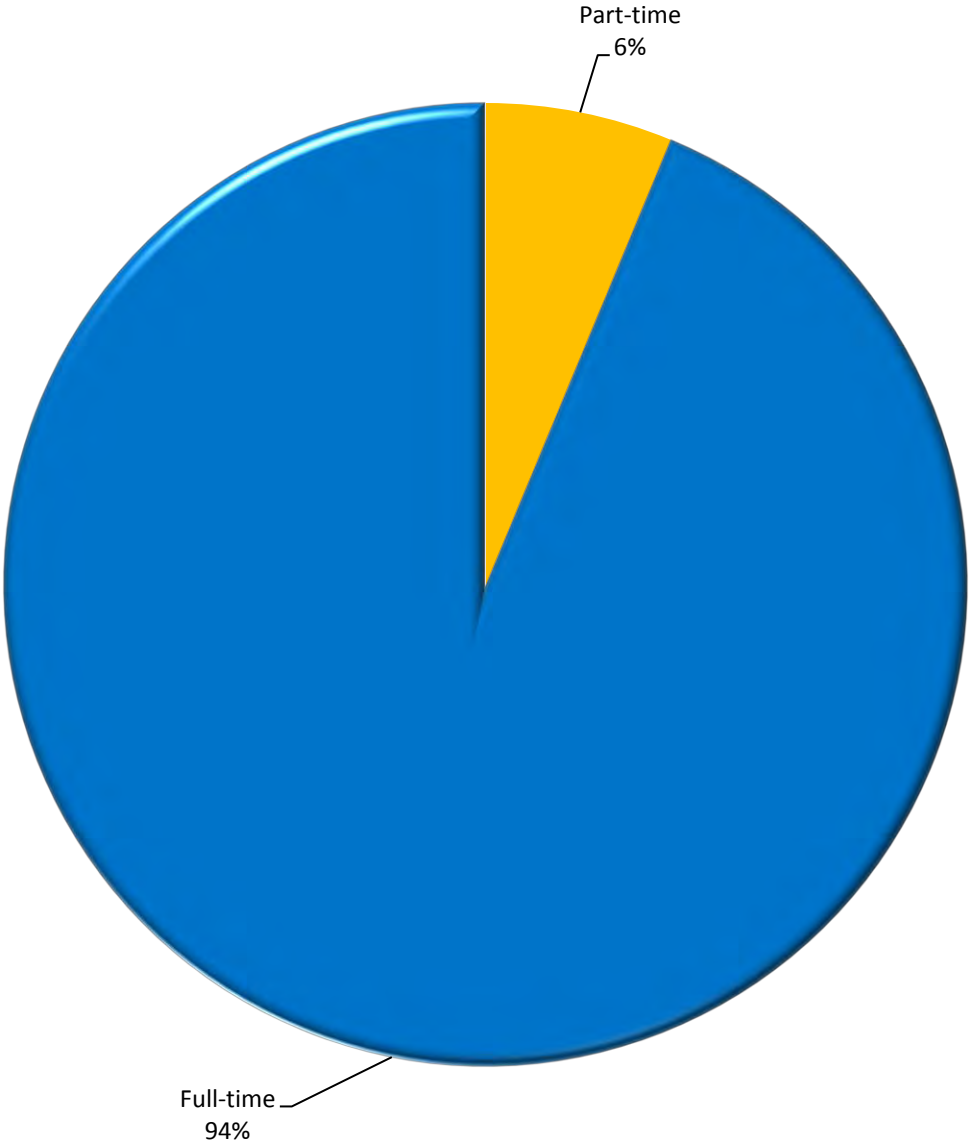

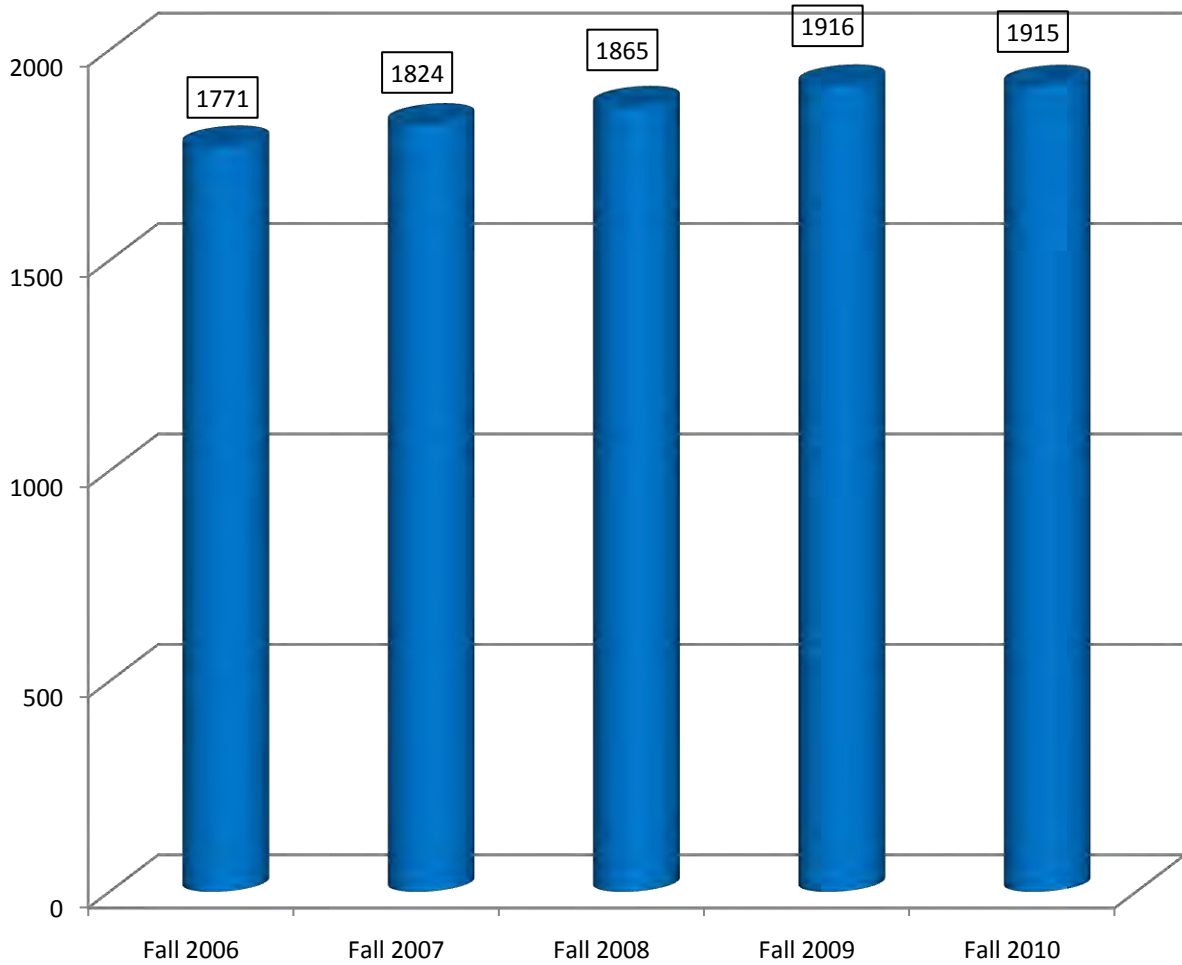


**PERCENT OF FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME STUDENTS**
