Dr. Kenneth L. E. Manders is the first graduate of Oakwood to serve as President of the Bermuda Conference of Seventh-day Adventist. Before assuming administrative responsibilities, Manders served as the senior Pastor of the Hamilton SDA church for 13 years.

During his 27 years of Pastoral Ministry Dr. Manders led the Bermuda Conference in soulwinning for 16 years, while serving as Youth Director; Personal Ministries Director; and Executive Secretary.



A native of Bermuda, Manders received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Oakwood College, now University, a Master of Divinity degree, and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Andrews Theological Seminary.

He received the Mosley/Warren Homiletic & Preaching Award at Oakwood University in 1992.

Before any formal training for ministry Elder Manders served as a full-time Literature Evangelist in the Bermuda Mission for 4 years.

Dr. Manders enjoys giving Bible studies, listening to music, and watching sports. He is married to Claudette Manders, and they are the proud parents of three sons; Andre, Stephen, and Joseph.

Divine Worship Speaker

Dr. Glenward Alexander Bryant first felt his call to ministry just one year after becoming a member of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Later, as he observed his pastor preaching the Word with fiery enthusiasm at an evangelistic meeting, he sensed the calling again, and knew exactly what God wanted him to do.

At the age of 19, his love for evangelism and teaching led him to serve as a student missionary in Japan for one year. Experiencing mission service in another country was life-changing, transforming his understanding of other cultures and traditions. Not only

did this solidify his desire to go into ministry, but also revealed how God can use anyone whose life is in His hands. In college, his gift of administration flourished, and he started to serve as director of Adventist Youth at Oakwood College and as president of the Black Students Association of the Seminary (BSAS) at Andrews University.

Dr. Bryant earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in theology and business administration from Oakwood College in 1981. He began his pastoral ministry in Springfield, Missouri and in Coffeyville and Independence, Kansas in 1982. He was ordained to the gospel ministry in 1986 and earned his Master of Divinity degree from Andrews University in 1988. He went on to serve as Temperance director, Youth/Pathfinders/National Service Organization director, and superintendent of Education at the Central States Conference before being elected conference president in 1997.

The General Conference Executive Committee elected Dr. Bryant to serve as executive secretary of the North American Division in October 2008, in Manila, Philippines. He was reelected in Atlanta, Georgia at the 2010 General Conference Session. In December 2011, he received his Doctor of Ministry degree from Fuller Theological Seminary.

Dr. Bryant currently serves as the fifth president of the North American Division and vice president of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. He enjoys studying the word of God, gardening, being out in nature, especially near water, home remodeling and construction, and bike riding.

Dr. Bryant is happily married to the former Desiree Wimbish, current associate director of the NAD Ministerial Association. She formerly served as assistant director of the NAD Education Department, superintendent of Education of the Central States Conference, associate superintendent of Education of the Potomac Conference, and principal of the V. Lindsay Seventh-day Adventist School in Kansas City, Kansas. Dr. and Mrs. Bryant are the proud parents of Travis (Jacquelyn), Traven, and Terrence. They have three granddaughters.

Dastor Darnisha Thomas has had a passion for ministry since the tender age of 11 and has since been led to share the gospel of Jesus, physically and virtually, in various parts of the United States, Africa, Cuba, Panama, Honduras, and the United Kingdom.

Born and raised in Maryland, Pastor Darnisha is a graduate of Oakwood University and holds a Bachelors in Theology with a concentration in Pastoral/Evangelistic Ministry and a minor in Biblical Languages. She also has a Master's in Divinity from Andrews University Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary.

Pastor Darnisha Thomas currently serves as Associate Pastor at the Southview Seventh-day Adventist Church, in Minneapolis, Minnesota and is the Children's Ministries Director for the Minnesota Conference. She formerly served as the Pastor for Student Ministries and Volunteering at the New Hope Seventh-day Adventist Church in Fulton, Maryland. Pastor Thomas is the first Black pastor for both the New Hope and Southview churches, and the first and only Black woman pastor serving in the Minnesota Conference. She is also the youngest conference Children's Ministries director in the North American Division. Recently, Pastor Darnisha presented for the Children's Pastors Conference, organized by the International Network of Children's Ministry.

Pastor Thomas has published work and has been featured in Spectrum Magazine, Ordained Magazine, and the Current Magazine. She was also featured on the Hope Channel, as a guest on the Cross Connection program and the General Conference Youth Ministries E-week of Prayer.

Pastor Darnisha Thomas currently hosts a podcast called, "The Sister Pastor Speaks", where she shares her insights and experiences on being a woman of color in pastoral ministry, empowering upcoming women clergy to embrace their calling and their own identity in Christ while fostering the atmosphere of sisterhood.

Pastor Darnisha has an unquenchable love for Jesus and wants others to know who He is and learn to love and trust Him. Her birth promise is Philippians 1:6, "And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns."
