This is a suggested four-year plan. Please consult with your Department of Nursing advisor. General education courses are taken in the first 2 years and nursing courses in the Junior and Senior years. Students entering the University Fall 2021 and forward will follow this program of study.

The Oakwood University Bulletin contains the only official listing of graduation requirements. Each student is responsible for meeting Bulletin requirements.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE GENERIC BACCALAUREATE OPTION:

1. Admission by the university and submission of a separate application to nursing. Admission to the university does not guarantee admission to a specific department's program.
2. University cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.00 or above on a 4.00 scale.
3. ACT composite score of 19 or above, or SAT composite score of 960 or above. Satisfactory completion of developmental courses, identified by low ACT/SAT scores, "C" (2.00) or above.
4. Demonstrated reading level at $13^{\text {th }}$ grade, as indicated through diagnostic testing on the Nelson Denny Exam. administered by the Center for Student Success (CSS).
5. No grade less than C in the Sciences (biology, chemistry) courses.
6. Achieve a cumulative score of 75 percent or above on the HESI Admission Assessment Exam (Reading/Comprehension, Math, Anatomy \& Physiology, Grammar)
7. All freshman students who have declared Nursing as a major and have the required admission requirements must take the following science courses in the first semester of their freshman year:
a. BI 111 - Human anatomy \& Physiology/Lab
b. CH 101 - Intro to Inorganic/Lab

## Notes:

1. Students having two failures (C- or less) in the hard sciences or two failures in previous nursing course are not eligible for admission to the nursing program. This policy does not apply to NU107 Intro to Professional Nursing taken at Oakwood University, which is open to non-nursing majors.

## GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS VARIATIONS

1. Modern Foreign Language: Students who have not passed two years of the same foreign language in high school must take six hours of a modern foreign language otherwise omit.
2. Mathematics: Choose one of the following courses: MA101 or 108
3. Physical Education Activity Courses: Choose two of the following: PE 101, PE102, 120, 122, 126, 128, 150, 155, $207,215,222,224,245,247,249,260,261,275$, or 280
4. African-American Culture Course: Choose from HI265, HI267, HI268, EN221, EN 313, or MU323 (also meets a requirement above)
